- WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City Council of the City of Mesquite, Texas ("City Council") to protect the public health, safety, and welfare; and
- **WHEREAS,** the City Council reviews the City's Comprehensive Fee Schedule annually to ensure the City's fees are sufficient to cover costs for City services; and
- **WHEREAS**, the City Council finds, determines, and declares that certain fees are necessary to provide for efficient government services; and
- WHEREAS, the City Council finds and determines that the current fees are insufficient to cover the costs of the respective services; and
- **WHEREAS**, the City Council desires to adopt fees necessary for the City to provide good and efficient government for the benefit of the citizens of the City; and
- WHEREAS, Texas Local Government Code, Chapter 214, Subchapter Z, Section 214.908 ("Section 214.908") requires the City Council to reauthorize building permit fees prior to the 10th anniversary after the date the fee is adopted or most recently reauthorized; and
- **WHEREAS,** Section 214.908 also requires the City Council to hold a public hearing regarding the reauthorization of any building permit fees; and

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WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on this date in accordance with Section 214.908 (b)(1); and

**WHEREAS**, upon full review and consideration of all matters attendant and related thereto, the City Council is of the opinion this ordinance should be approved and adopted.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

# **SECTION 1.** Recitals Incorporated.

The City Council hereby finds and determines the recitals made in the preamble of this ordinance are true and correct, and hereby incorporates such recitals here in the body of this ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

# **SECTION 2. Mesquite City Code Text Amendments.**

Chapter 9 (Motor Vehicles and Traffic), Chapter 10 (Offenses – Miscellaneous), Chapter 11 (Planning and Development), and Chapter 15 (Streets and Sidewalks) ("Chapters 9, 10, 11, and 15") of the Mesquite City Code, as amended, is hereby amended by making certain deletions and additions as identified in **EXHIBIT A**, attached hereto and made a part hereof, and in all other respects said Chapters shall remain in full force and effect.

# **SECTION 3. Mesquite City Code Text Amendment.**

APPENDIX D – COMPREHENSIVE FEE SCHEDULE ("Appendix D") of the Mesquite City Code, as amended, is hereby amended by making certain deletions and additions as identified in **EXHIBIT B**, attached hereto and made a part hereof, and in all other respects said Appendix D shall remain in full force and effect.

# **SECTION 4.** Reauthorize Building Permit Fees and All Other Fees.

In accordance with Texas Local Government Code, Chapter 214, Subchapter Z, Section 214.908 ("Section 214.908") the City Council hereby reauthorizes any building permit fees and all other fees as identified in **EXHIBIT B** and in Mesquite City Code, Appendix D – Comprehensive Fee Schedule, as may be amended.

# **SECTION 5.** Public Hearing.

In accordance with <u>Section 214.908</u> the City Council on this date held a public hearing prior to any formal action on this item.

# **SECTION 6.** Conflicts Resolution Clause.

In the event of an irreconcilable conflict between the provisions of another previously adopted ordinance of the City of Mesquite and the provisions of this Ordinance, the provisions of this Ordinance shall be controlling.
