HOPE'S DOOR NEW BEGINNINGS CENTER	Amount Requested: \$30,000	Recommended Funding: \$20,000
<p>Hope's Door is a non-profit organization that provides intervention and prevention services to individuals and families affected by domestic family violence. Services include emergency transportation, safety planning, and direct advocacy to navigate the complexities of finding stability and safety. Their REACH Advocates are crucial in ensuring that every person who reaches out for help receives comprehensive, immediate support, making a direct impact on the lives of those in crisis.</p> <p><i>Expected Outcome:</i> Support will serve 40 unduplicated Mesquite domestic violence victims.</p>		
SHARING LIFE COMMUNITY OUTREACH Rental Assistance	Amount Requested: \$75,000	Recommended Funding: \$30,000
<p>Sharing Life Community Outreach is a non-profit organization that provides various programs and services to Mesquite's low-income population. Sharing Life will use requested Rental Assistance funds for emergency payments for past due rent and hotel payments to address homelessness.</p> <p><i>Expected Outcome:</i> Funds will assist an estimated 50 households with rental and hotel payments.</p>		
SHARING LIFE COMMUNITY OUTREACH Agency Utilities	Amount Requested: \$40,000	Recommended Funding: \$25,000
<p>Sharing Life Community Outreach is a non-profit organization that provides various programs and services to Mesquite's low-income population. Sharing Life will use requested funds to cover the agency's utility bills incurred while serving clients: TXU, Atmos, and City of Mesquite Water Department</p> <p><i>Expected Outcome:</i> An approximate 6,000 Mesquite households will be served by the Agency's Utility grant.</p>		
THE FAMILY PLACE	Amount Requested: \$28,000	Recommended Funding: \$13,850
<p>The Family Place provides counseling, emergency shelter, and case management services to victims of domestic violence. Also, provide counseling and intervention services to batterers and abusers to prevent/end violence.</p> <p><i>Expected Outcome:</i> Funding would provide counseling, referrals, and emergency services to a minimum 100 Mesquite residents experiencing DV.</p>		
THE SENIOR SOURCE	Amount Requested: \$16,000	Recommended Funding: \$16,000
<p>The Senior Source is a non-profit agency that assist seniors and their families with a range of age-related issues such as: finances, transportation, and companionship. The Senior Source Ombudsman program exists as an advocacy program for elderly Mesquite residents in long-term care facilities with the goal of resolving various client concerns such as long-term care issues, resident's rights, and abuse and neglect.</p> <p><i>Expected Outcome:</i> Visit eight nursing homes in Mesquite twice a month.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Assist approximately 1,000 individuals, with 600 one-on-one consultations. • Staff will handle an estimated 125 complaints through 192 visits. 		
VISITING NURSE ASSOCIATION	Amount Requested: \$99,400	Recommended Funding: \$38,434
<p>Visiting Nurse Association provides a "Meals-on-Wheels" program that provides home-delivered meals five days a week to homebound or disabled seniors in Mesquite. The Visiting Nurse Association is a non-profit that provides healthcare services to the elderly and disabled individuals who are also homebound. They are also requesting funds for 1 FTE for their Community Health Worker (CHW) team.</p>

SUMMER YOUTH INTERNSHIP PROGRAM	Amount Requested: \$15,00	Recommended Funding: \$15,000
<p>The Summer Youth Internship Program provides workforce experience for high school students during the summer. Workforce Solutions Greater Dallas will provide training for students prior to the beginning of the internships.</p> <p><i>Expected Outcome:</i> Total funding will provide job training for an estimated 15-20 Youth interns in 2025.</p>		
ENVIRONMENTAL CODE	Amount Requested: \$200,000	Recommended Funding: \$200,000
<p>The Environmental Code Enforcement Division will use fund to reimburse salaries of Code Enforcement Officers who identify nuisance and code violations within CDBG areas.</p> <p><i>Expected Outcomes:</i> Funds will be used to assist in the code enforcement of approximately 21,535 households in CDBG areas only.</p>		
HOUSING REHAB	Amount Requested: \$	Recommended Funding: \$571,944
<p>The Housing Rehabilitation program is administered through CDBG. The Housing Rehabilitation Program is a program dedicated to rehabilitating single-residential homes for Mesquite residents. Funds will be used to assist approximately 21 households through Housing Rehabilitation & Emergency Repairs. These 21 households may receive a maximum of up to \$35,000 in Rehabilitation Assistance funding for a variety of services, such as full housing rehabilitation and exterior renewal. Emergency repairs up to \$8,000.</p> <p><i>Expected Outcomes:</i> 21 Housing Rehabilitation and Emergency Repairs</p>
