## **APPOINTMENTS TO BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES**

- 12 Consider appointment of two members (Position Nos. 3 and 7) to the Animal Services Advisory Committee for terms to expire December 31, 2027.

**Mr. Casper moved to appoint Aleecia Yesh, Manager of Animal Services, as a Regular Member (Position No. 3) to the Animal Services Advisory Committee for a term to expire December 31, 2027. Motion was seconded by Mr. Green and approved unanimously.**

## **PUBLIC HEARINGS**

- 13 Conduct a public hearing and consider an ordinance for Zoning Application No. Z1125-0427, submitted by Mayse Associates on behalf of Chick-fil-A, Inc., for a change of zoning from Commercial within the Town East Retail and Restaurant Area (TERRA) Overlay District to Planned Development - Commercial within the TERRA Overlay District to allow uses permitted in Commercial zoning and to modify development standards located on a ~1.8-acre portion of 1638 and 1800 North Town East Boulevard.

(No responses in favor or in opposition to the application have been received from property owners within the statutory notification area. The Planning and Zoning Commission recommends approval with certain stipulations.)

**A public hearing was held for Zoning Application No. Z1125-0427.**

**Adam Bailey, Director of Planning and Development Services, stated that the applicant, representing Chick-fil-A, is requesting a Planned Development (PD) rezoning for the former Payless Shoes site at 1638 North Town East Boulevard to allow redevelopment of a larger restaurant with four drive-through lanes, replacing its existing nearby location. While a restaurant is permitted by right, the PD is requested to accommodate modifications consistent with Chick-fil-A's operational standards. Key requests include additional menu and pre-order boards (up to eight in total) and wall signage on all sides of the building, exceeding current Sign Ordinance limits. The applicant also proposes oversized drive-through canopies.**

**Mr. Bailey stated that the project is being developed by Southwest Development**

Company in coordination with Macy's; however, the PD would apply only to the Chick-fil-A site and not the larger property. The proposed landscaping, parking, screening, and cross-access provisions meet or exceed the standards established in the PD for the redevelopment of the Sears property.

Mr. Bailey presented a second option for the pylon monument sign which would match the pylon monument sign for the Sears redevelopment.

Applicant Getra Sanders, representing Chick-fil-A Corporate, stated that the redevelopment of Chick-fil-A will enhance the control of traffic and quality of service provided. The applicant agrees to the pylon monument sign suggestion that matches the Sears sign and other signs onsite.

Tammy Jo Strong, 1713 Cool Springs Drive, expressed support for the proposed application.

No others appeared regarding the proposed application.

Mr. Casper moved to approve Zoning Application No. Z1125-0427, as recommended by the Planning and Zoning Commission, with certain stipulations, and to approve Ordinance No. 5240, (Option 2) as presented to the City Council at tonight's meeting, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING THE MESQUITE ZONING ORDINANCE BY APPROVING A CHANGE OF ZONING FROM COMMERCIAL WITHIN THE TOWN EAST RETAIL AND RESTAURANT AREA (TERRA) OVERLAY DISTRICT TO PLANNED DEVELOPMENT – COMMERCIAL WITHIN THE TERRA OVERLAY DISTRICT TO ALLOW USES PERMITTED IN COMMERCIAL ZONING AND TO MODIFY DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS LOCATED ON AN APPROXIMATELY 1.8-ACRE PORTION OF 1638 AND 1800 NORTH TOWN EAST BOULEVARD; PROVIDING A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED \$2,000.00; PROVIDING PUBLICATION OF THE CAPTION HEREOF; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. Motion was seconded by Mr. Murden and approved unanimously. (Ordinance No. 5240 recorded in Ordinance No. 137.)

Conduct a public hearing and consider a resolution approving the termination of an Economic Development Program Chapter 380 Agreement between the City and SRB Mesquite, LLC, a Texas limited liability company, dated effective January 1, 2025, and approving the terms and conditions of an Amended and Restated Chapter 380 Economic Development and Performance Agreement ("New Agreement") between the City and SRB Mesquite, LLC, to promote economic development and to incentivize SRB Mesquite, LLC, to continue redeveloping an existing building and surrounding area located at 1738 North Town East Boulevard in the City of Mesquite, Texas; authorizing the City Manager to finalize and execute the new agreement and administer the new agreement on behalf of the City.

A public hearing was held to consider a resolution approving the termination of an Economic Development Program Chapter 380 Agreement between the City and SRB Mesquite, LLC, a Texas limited liability company, dated effective January 1, 2025, and approving the terms and conditions of an Amended and Restated Chapter 380 Economic Development and Performance Agreement ("New Agreement") between the City and SRB Mesquite, LLC.

Kim Buttram, Director of Economic Development, stated that the City of Mesquite

entered into an agreement with SRB Mesquite, LLC, which was approved by the City Council on October 6, 2025, to facilitate the commercial development of an 18.6513-acre parcel of land and redevelopment of an existing building at 1738 North Town East Boulevard, as part of the Town East Mall area formerly occupied by Sears. The agreement required the company to construct a 58,000-square-foot Main Event brand family entertainment business within the former Sears building, opening by December 31, 2026, and with a 10-year lease. As a result of changing market conditions for the parent owner of Main Event (Dave and Busters) resulting in constriction of national store expansions, the developer of the site proposes a new international entertainment anchor, Round1, to occupy a minimum 85,000 square feet under a 10-year lease.

Ms. Buttram stated that the proposed new anchor offers bowling, arcade, pickle ball, full restaurant, karaoke, and other activities for families and corporate clientele, and has locations throughout the world. The Mesquite location would be the first in Dallas County.

Ms. Buttram stated that like the original agreement, the amended and restated agreement requires the Company to make a minimum capital investment of \$25M; however, the requirement for completion and Certificate of Occupancy is proposed to be extended for six months, from July 1, 2027, to December 31, 2027.

Ms. Buttram stated that the amended and restated agreement proposes additional annual sales requirements generated by the businesses on the site, increasing year one performance to \$150,000.00 paid to the City (approximately \$15M in taxable sales - previously \$100,000.00/\$10M), year two performance to \$200,000.00 paid to the City (approximately \$20M in taxable sales - previously \$150,000.00/\$15M), and years three - 10 performance to \$250,000.00 paid to the City (approximately \$25M in taxable sales - previously \$200,000.00/\$20M). Additionally, the amended and reinstated agreement remains unchanged regarding outparcel development and the incentive amount - a one-cent State Use and Sales Tax rebate on any qualifying businesses built on the tract by December 31, 2030.

Ms. Buttram stated that a \$500,000.00 bonus incentive remains available to the Company, should the Company secure a 5-year lease for a minimum 6,000-square-foot Vidorra restaurant; however, the location would be on the second floor of the old Sears vs. the first floor as stated in the original agreement.

Applicant James Mason, representing Four Rivers Capital, presented an overview of the proposed redevelopment. Round1 is a Japanese entertainment company and arcade chain that operates large indoor entertainment centers. Round1 offers bowling, arcade games, claw machines, billiards, karaoke rooms, kid zone area, and Japanese inspired food and beverages. There are currently 49 locations in the United States and rapidly growing.

Vivian Johnson, 4538 Live Oak Drive, expressed support for the proposed resolution.

No others appeared regarding the proposed resolution.

Mr. Casper moved to approve Resolution No. 11-2026, A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, APPROVING THE

TERMINATION OF AN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM CHAPTER 380 AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY AND SRB MESQUITE, LLC, DATED EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2025, AND APPROVING THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF AN AMENDED AND RESTATED CHAPTER 380 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND PERFORMANCE AGREEMENT (“NEW AGREEMENT”) BETWEEN THE CITY AND SRB MESQUITE, LLC, TO PROMOTE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND TO INCENTIVIZE SRB MESQUITE, LLC, TO CONTINUE REDEVELOPING AN EXISTING BUILDING AND SURROUNDING AREA LOCATED AT 1738 NORTH TOWN EAST BOULEVARD IN THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO FINALIZE AND EXECUTE THE NEW AGREEMENT AND ADMINISTER THE NEW AGREEMENT ON BEHALF OF THE CITY. Motion was seconded by Mr. Green and approved unanimously. (Resolution No. 11-2026 recorded in Resolution Book No. 74.)

Mayor Alemán announced that the City Council would meet in Executive Session pursuant to Section 551.074 of the Texas Government Code to consider the appointment, evaluation, employment, reassignment, duties, discipline or dismissal of the City Manager, City Attorney, Municipal Court Judge, City Secretary, members of the various City boards and commissions, and City officers or other City employees (Item No. 15 - Discuss appointment of members to the Civil Service Commission/Personnel (Trial) Board); whereupon, the City Council proceeded to meet in the Council Conference Room. After the closed meeting ended at 8:39 p.m., the City Council reconvened in Open Session.

No executive action was necessary.
