PUBLIC HEARINGS

Conduct a public hearing and consider an ordinance for Zoning Application No. Z0126-0439, submitted by Dynamic Engineering on behalf of Johnson Development Associates, for a change of zoning to amend Planned Development - Light Commercial Ordinance No. 5159 to allow mini-warehousing, self-storage as a permitted use with modified development standards located on the southern 5-acre portion of 5201 Northwest Drive.

(One letter in favor and none in opposition to the application have been received from property owners within the statutory notification area. The Planning and Zoning Commission recommends approval with certain stipulations.)

A public hearing was held regarding Zoning Application No. Z0126-0439.

Adam Bailey, Director of Planning and Development Services, stated that the applicant is proposing to develop an undeveloped 5-acre tract at 5201 Northwest Drive with a self-storage facility. Under the existing zoning, mini-warehouse/self-storage uses require approval of a Conditional Use Permit. However, to facilitate the development, the applicant is requesting an amendment to the Planned Development (PD) Ordinance No. 5159 to allow the use with modified development standards on the southern 5-acre portion of Tract 2, which will be referred to as Tract 3 in the proposed ordinance. PD Ordinance No. 5159 governs approximately 22 acres across two tracts, with Tract 1 currently under construction as a multifamily development and Tract 2 consisting of approximately 10 undeveloped acres zoned Light Commercial. The proposed two-story self-storage facility will consist of a single 115,000-square-foot building with a maximum height of 30 feet. While most storage units will be accessed internally, some ground-floor units will have external access via overhead doors located on the north, south, and west elevations. The proposed PD amendment will also require screening, including an 8-foot masonry wall or wrought-iron fence with an evergreen living screen and hedgerows, berming along IH-30 frontage road, downward-facing lighting and additional landscaping along public frontages.

Applicant Bill Dahlstrom, representing Johnson Development Associates; and Greer Condon, Real Estate Manager with Johnson Development Associates, presented an overview of the proposed application.

Mr. Dahlstrom stated that gate hours will be 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. and office hours will be 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. He stated that the applicant is agreeable to staff recommendations.

No one appeared regarding the proposed application.

Mr. Casper moved to approved Zoning Application No. Z0126-0439, as recommended by the Planning and Zoning Commission, with certain stipulations, and to approve Ordinance No. 5251, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING THE MESQUITE ZONING ORDINANCE BY APPROVING A CHANGE OF ZONING TO AMEND PLANNED DEVELOPMENT ("PD") - LIGHT COMMERCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 5159, TO ALLOW MINIWAREHOUSING / SELF-STORAGE AS A PERMITTED USE IN THE PD WITH MODIFIED DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS AND CONCEPT PLAN FOR THE SOUTHERN FIVE-ACRE PORTION IDENTIFIED AS TRACT 3, LOCATED AT 5201 NORTHWEST

Conduct a public hearing and consider an ordinance for Zoning Application No. Z0226-0441, submitted by WRA Architects, on behalf of Mesquite Independent School District (MISD) for a change of zoning from Single-Family Residential R-3 to Single-Family Residential R-3 with a Conditional Use Permit to allow an elementary school located at 3719 and 4000 Moon Drive.

(Two responses in favor and none in opposition to the application have been received from property owners within the statutory notification area. The Planning and Zoning Commission recommends approval.)

A public hearing was held regarding Zoning Application No. Z0226-0441.

Adam Bailey, Director of Planning and Development Services, stated that the applicant is requesting a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) to construct a new elementary school located at the northeast corner of Motley Drive and Moon Drive. The project is part of the 2025 Mesquite ISD Bond Program approved by voters and will replace the existing Motley and Lawrence Elementary Schools. The proposed redevelopment of the school campus is designed to accommodate up to 700 students at build out, exceeding the current combined enrollment of approximately 550 students and allowing for long-term growth. Redevelopment of the Motley Elementary School site will significantly increase on-site stacking and parking capacity. The primary drop-off and pick-up area will be accessed from Moon Drive and will provide more than 2,000 feet of stacking space outside of the fire lane. In addition, on-site parking will increase from 65 to 110 spaces. The applicant submitted a traffic management plan that was reviewed and accepted by the Traffic Engineering Department.

Applicant Kenny Gilbert, representing WRA Architects, presented an overview of the proposed application and site plan. The secondary drop-off lanes will be along Hyde Park Drive and will serve primarily Pre-K and Kindergarten students. The primary drop-off lane is a one-way lane along Moon Drive with vehicles exiting along Motley Drive. Construction will begin in September 2026 with an estimated completion date of 2028. Motley Elementary and Lawrence Elementary are to be demolished once construction of the new school is complete.

No one appeared regarding the proposed application.

Mr. Green moved to approved Zoning Application No. Z0226-0441, as recommended by the Planning and Zoning Commission, with certain stipulations, and to approve Ordinance No. 5252, AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MESQUITE ZONING ORDINANCE BY APPROVING A CHANGE OF ZONING FROM R-3, SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL TO R-3, SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL WITH A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT TO ALLOW A NEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOL ON THE

PROPERTY LOCATED AT 3719 AND 4000 MOON DRIVE; REPEALING ALL OTHER ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED \$2,000.00; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION OF THE CAPTION HEREOF; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. Motion was seconded by Mr. Casper and approved unanimously. (Ordinance No. 5252 recorded in Ordinance Book No. 137.)
