#### **Overview & Background**

The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) is a grant provided by the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The CDBG program provides the City of Mesquite with the opportunity to develop viable communities by funding activities that provide decent housing, a suitable living environment, and by expanding economic opportunities principally for low and moderate-income persons.

On March 27, 2020, in response to the coronavirus pandemic, the United States Congress passed the CARES Act. From the CARES Act, Mesquite received over \$1,500,000 in Community Development Block Grant – COVID-19 (CDBG-CV) funds for emergency assistance to individuals, families, public service agencies and small businesses directly affected by the coronavirus.

CDBG and CDBG-CV funds were awarded to carry out a wide range of community development activities directed toward neighborhood revitalization, economic development and the provision of community facilities and services. During the 2022 program year, the City's CDBG funds were used for Homeowner Single-Family Residential Rehabilitation, Code Enforcement, Grant Administration, and Public Services. CDBG-CV funding was allocated to programs that address Affordable Housing, Food Security, Domestic Violence, Youth, and Mental Healthcare.
