> The Regional Transportation Council (RTC) members of the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) are reappointed in June of even numbered years. Currently our four municipalities are clustered together and can appoint only one RTC representative for the four-city cluster. Due to the City of Mesquite's population, Mesquite has held the primary seat at the RTC since 1978. According to the RTC bylaws, representation for clusters of cities is based upon population. The City of Mesquite's 2021 population represents more than 74 percent of the total 2021 population of the four cities.

> Currently, Councilmember Tandy Boroughs and I are respectively the primary and alternate RTC members representing our four-city cluster. In addition, our Public Works Director also routinely attends RTC meetings. I respectfully request your endorsement for myself continuing as primary member and Tandy Boroughs as alternate member for the next two-year cycle by May 18, 2022.

All RTC agendas are posted online at https://www.nctcog.org/trans/committees/rtc/, and you should already be receiving communications directly from the NCTCOG staff on project calls, training opportunities and other items of interest. If you wish to become more involved in the transportation issues facing our region.

I suggest you, a councilmember, or a member of your staff consider attending a few RTC meetings to better determine your level of interest and participation. If there are issues or questions you wish the RTC to address or answer, please forward them to me so that I or Councilmember Boroughs may act as your advocate. Dear Mayors Alemán, Gordon, George and Childress:

The North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) is the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Dallas-Fort Worth Metropolitan Area. The Regional Transportation Council (RTC), composed primarily of local elected officials, is the transportation policy body for the MPO. The RTC is responsible for direction and approval of the Metropolitan Transportation Plan, the Transportation Improvement Program, the Congestion Management Process, and the Unified Planning Work Program, and for satisfying and implementing federal and state laws and regulations pertaining to the regional transportation planning process.

Membership on the Regional Transportation Council is either by direct membership or group representation. Each seat on the Regional Transportation Council will be provided a primary member and permitted an alternate member. The Cities of Mesquite, Balch Springs, Sunnyvale, and Seagoville share a seat on the Regional Transportation Council. The RTC's Bylaws and Operating Procedures state that the person representing a group of several cities shall be selected by the mayors using a weighted vote of the maximum population or employment of the cities represented, and the person selected shall serve a two-year term beginning in July of even-numbered years and shall be serving on one of the governing bodies they represent. A table containing population and employment figures is enclosed. The Bylaws further state that in the spirit of integrated transportation planning, all cities within a city-only cluster are eligible to hold the RTC membership seat for the cluster, and the cities should strongly consider rotation of the seat among the entities within the respective cluster. Items to consider when contemplating seat rotation may include: 1) a natural break in a member's government service, such as the conclusion of an elected term, 2) a member's potential to gain an officer position or advance through the officer ranks, 3) a member's strong performance and commitment to transportation planning, or 4) the critical nature of a particular issue or project and its impact on an entity within the cluster.

An alternate member is the individual appointed to represent an entity or group of entities on the Regional Transportation Council in the absence of the primary member. The alternate member must be predetermined in advance of a meeting and will have voting rights in the absence of the primary

member. An entity or group of entities may elect to appoint its alternate member(s) from a pool of eligible nominees. The same requirements apply to alternate members as to primary members. If a primary member is an elected official, then the alternate member must also be an elected official; if a primary member is a non-elected individual, then the alternate member can be either a non-elected individual or an elected official. A best practice for city-only clusters may be to appoint the alternate member from an eligible entity within the cluster that is not providing the primary member.

Your current primary representative on the RTC is Daniel Alemán Jr., Mayor, City of Mesquite. Your current alternate representative is Tandy Boroughs, Deputy Mayor Pro Tem, City of Mesquite. You may choose to keep your current representatives or appoint a new primary representative and/or alternate representative. All appointments, whether a reappointment or new appointment, must be received by June 30, 2022. Per the RTC Bylaws, the new two-year terms begin in July. Please email (VPruitt-Jenkins@nctcog.org), mail (P.O. Box 5888, Arlington, TX 76005-5888), or fax (817/640-3028) your correspondence to Vercie Pruitt-Jenkins of NCTCOG. Please note that your designations must be confirmed in writing by all entities included in this group. Once the appointments have been determined by weighted vote, confirmation of the primary and/or alternate member(s) will be provided to your group.

In addition, the Regional Transportation Council has established an Ethics Policy in accordance with Section 472.034 of the Texas Transportation Code. This policy applies to both primary and alternate RTC members, whether elected or non-elected. All RTC members must also adhere to Chapter 171 of the Local Government Code and to the Code of Ethics from their respective local governments and public agencies. Please remind your representatives to be cognizant of these policies and codes.




Summary

The estimated January 1, 2021 population for the NCTCOG region is 7,874,950. Last year the region added 158,540 people. Even though the north central Texas region, as well as the rest of the country faced a big challenge due to the pandemic, the region still managed to grow by almost the same amount as it did in 2019. In 2020, 12 cities grew by 10% or more. Fort Worth led the region in growth, adding almost 17,000 people last year while Frisco added close to 16,000, followed by McKinney with 6,100 and Dallas with 5,560. Collin, Denton, Dallas, and Tarrant Counties each added more than 25,000 people last year, with Collin County leading the way with 43,000 new residents. The region has added more than 1.3 million new residents since 2010.

Population estimates are based on current housing inventories for cities in the NCTCOG Region with populations of 1,000 or more.



2021 Population Estimates Methodology

NCTCOG uses the housing unit method for estimating current year population:

Estimated household population = estimated units * estimated occupancy rate * estimated persons per occupied unit

The calculation is performed for each unit type (single family, multi-family, other). The results are summed along with an estimate of group quarters population to arrive at a total population estimate. Every year, cities are asked to provide information about changes in housing stock and population in group quarters housing. Cities are also given the opportunity to review figures prior to release. Heath and West Tawakoni did not participate in the survey. The 2020 population estimates for some cities have been revised. The estimates included herein supersede any prior estimates.

Various totals and percentages provided throughout this report are calculated on rounded figures and therefore might not match precise sums and percentages calculated on unrounded figures.
