The City Council reserves the right to adjourn into executive session at any time during the course of this meeting to discuss any of the matters posted on this agenda, when such executive session is authorized by Government Code Section 551.071 (Consultation with Attorney), 551.072 (Deliberations regarding Property), 551.073 (Deliberations regarding Gifts or Donations), 551.074 (Personnel 551.076 (Deliberations Devices regarding Security or Security Audits) and 551.087 (Economic Development); Texas Tax Code Section 321.3022 (Sales Tax Information) and Texas Government Code Section 418.183(f) (Emergency Management).
